Checking In/Out: Check-in is from **3:00-6:00 p.m.** on the day of arrival unless otherwise arranged. Please call the office during these hours if you will be arriving late. Check-out is by **11:00 a.m.** on the day of departure unless otherwise arranged.

Driving Directions: Please visit our website, www.leonimeadows.org, for the most accurate map and driving directions. **DO NOT rely on directions from internet map sites or GPS devices.**

Late Arrivals: Please check at the registration window for an envelope containing your lodging assignment.

Quiet Time: Quiet time hours are between 10:00 p.m. and 6:30 a.m. Please be respectful of your neighbors.

Supervision: Each group is responsible to provide proper supervision to assure compliance with the camp policies. **Children must be supervised at all times.**

Pets: Please leave your pets at home with a pet sitter, as our policy is “No Pets Allowed.” While your family appreciates the sights and sounds of your pet, other guests frequently find them disruptive to their weekend retreat. Additional charges may apply for non-compliance with this policy.

Accidents/Medical Emergency: Marshall Hospital, located in Placerville, is the closest medical facility. Leoni Meadows does not have medical personnel on staff. Leoni Meadows will not assume liability for accidents or injuries covered under group outing insurance policies. Groups are responsible for providing medical coverage for their group and for providing proof of coverage to Leoni Meadows.

Emergency Phone Number: The number to give for emergencies is 530.626.3610. After office hours, a message will direct callers to administrative staff. Please check for messages at the Registration Desk in the Leoni Lodge.

Parking: Parking areas are provided at the west end of the Meadow Lodge and at the entry to the RV/Camping area. There is one parking space at each cabin. Parking is prohibited on the sides of roadways, in the wooded or meadow areas, or any place it would restrict access of emergency and service vehicles. **NOTE: Parking in front of the Meadow Lodge is for quick loading or unloading only.**

Handicap Parking: There are two handicap spaces in front of the Leoni Lodge and three spaces in front of the Meadow Lodge. Please display appropriate tags when parking in these spaces.

Telephones: Cell phones **DO NOT work at Leoni Meadows.** Rooms do not have phones. There are phones located in the Leoni Lodge lobby, Meadow Lodge lobbies, and the Dorm lobby. Calling card, collect, and credit card calls can be made from these phones. If someone calls to speak with you, a message will be taken and posted at the Registration Desk in the Leoni Lodge.

Faxes/Copies: For your convenience, a copy machine is available for necessary copying at \$0.10 per copy. To send a fax is \$1.00/1st page, \$0.50 each additional page, and to receive a fax is \$0.50 a page. Our fax number is 530.626.8524.

Internet Access: Wireless internet access is available in the Leoni Lodge lobby. Laptops must contain a wireless card.

Food Service: Meal serving lines are generally open for **one hour.** Meal tickets are **non-refundable and non-transferable.** For example, if you miss an ordered breakfast, you cannot substitute lunch. The cafeteria is closed outside of meal times.

Standard Meal Times:

Supper	on the night of arrival 6:00-7:00 p.m.
Breakfast	8:00-9:00 a.m.
Lunch	12:30-1:30 p.m.
Supper	5:30-6:30 p.m.

Food Policy: To keep our facilities beautiful, we request that food and drink be limited to the designated eating areas. **Food and drink are prohibited from the lodge rooms, lodge lobbies, and meeting rooms.** Additional charges will apply for non-compliance with this policy.

ATVs/OHVs: Are to be operated only on improved roads within the camp and only for the purpose of accessing Forest Service trails. Do not drive on camp sidewalks, trails, or cross-country. Helmets must be worn. Do not allow passengers to ride in the back of pickup trucks or any other place on any vehicle not specifically designed for passengers.

Bicycles/Skateboards/Razor Scooters: May be used cautiously on vehicular roadways and parking lots but **not on pedestrian sidewalks or trails**. Helmets and shoes must be worn.

Campfires: Campfires are permitted only by permission from the camp management and are restricted to designated fire pits. High fire hazard may cause the cancellation of all campfire permits. Guests may use self-contained BBQ grills and camp stoves.

Camp Store: The Meadow Memories Camp Store is open on Sunday mornings after breakfast or as arranged. The store has a wide variety of T-shirts, sweatshirts, souvenirs and gifts.

Firearms/Fireworks: Discharging of firearms or fireworks or their possession on the grounds is strictly prohibited. Fireworks of any kind are illegal in El Dorado County.

Laundry Facilities: There is a coin-operated washer/dryer in the RV/Camping restroom facility available from April-October. Wash is \$0.75 and dry is \$0.50.

Lost and Found: If anything has been lost at camp, leave a description at the office. If the item is found, we will be happy to mail it to you in exchange for postage reimbursement. Unclaimed lost items will be kept for 30 days and then given to charity.

Maintenance Needs: If you notice something broken or in need of repair, please contact someone in the office. We may not know that it needs our attention.

Power Conservation: We ask that you please remember to turn off lights, heating/cooling units, fans, etc. when they are not in immediate use.

Radios/TVs/DVD Players: Please make sure that these are not audible to those in adjoining facilities or outside of your vehicle.

Restrooms: Public restrooms are located in the Leoni Lodge lobby, in the RV/Camping area, and in the cafeteria.

Tobacco, Alcohol, & Illegal Drugs: Leoni Meadows is a smoke-free, alcohol-free, drug-free environment. Smoking, drinking alcohol, or using illegal drugs is not permitted in any buildings or on Leoni Meadows property. Additional charges will apply for non-compliance with this policy.

Vegetation/Natural Surroundings: To keep the meadows and forests beautiful for years to come, we ask that guests not remove plants, rocks, or other items from the grounds, unless previous permission has been given by administration.

Wildlife: Guests should be aware that we co-inhabit Leoni Meadows with coyotes, deer, mountain lions, and the occasional black bear. Use caution when exploring the area, especially during the early morning and evening hours.

Check-Out RV/Camping: Please pick up trash around your site and make sure you've collected all of your belongings.

Check-Out Lodge Rooms: Please remove all **used** sheets, pillowcases, and bathroom linens. Please stack them in a pile by the bathroom door. **Leave** all mattress pads, blankets, and bedspreads on beds. Turn off lights and heating/cooling units. This will greatly assist our housekeeping department. Thank you!

Check-Out Cabins: Please pick up trash and follow cabin cleaning procedures located on the door of the cabin. Turn off the stove, oven, and lights.

Key Return: Please return your keys to the Registration Desk. There is a \$10.00 charge for each key not returned at the time of departure.

LODGING WHAT-TO-BRING LISTS

Lodge Rooms:

- Bedding is supplied for the number of beds in the room (most have two queen beds). If additional bedding such as sleeping bag or sleeping mat is needed, please bring it along.
- Bring your own toiletries, blow-dryer, and alarm clock!
- Extra towels are available at the Registration Office.

Cabins & Dorms:

- Bunk-beds each have one mattress.
- Bring all your own bedding (mattress cover, sleeping bag or sheets/blankets).
- Bring your own towels, washcloths, toiletries, blow-dryer, and alarm clock.
- If kitchenettes (Cabins Only) are used, bring all your own utensils, pots and pans, etc.

Campground:

- Most sites have access to hookups. There is a central dumping station.
- There is a public restroom/shower facility in the campground that is usually open April to October.
- Bring all your own towels, toiletries, alarm clock, etc. as needed!
- Extension cords are helpful.



ATTENTION: Group Leader

Please stress the importance of **NOT** using GPS devices, Google Maps or MapQuest for reliable driving directions to Leoni Meadows. Most of these methods will direct drivers off of paved & maintained roads.

This is a very serious matter that has led to lost & stranded travelers during hazardous weather conditions.

Directions to Somerset from Various Points

From Sacramento Area:
Take Hwy 50 to Missouri Flat Exit. Turn right off the freeway on Missouri Flat Road and continue to Pleasant Valley Road. Turn left and continue on Pleasant Valley Road 5.2 miles through Diamond Springs to Bucks Bar Road. Turn right on Bucks Bar Road, continue for 4.8 miles to Somerset. (See directions from Somerset to Leoni Meadows.)

From South Lake Tahoe—Pollock Pines Area:
Take Hwy E16 off Hwy 50 (this is the Sly Park Recreation Area exit in Pollock Pines.) Go south on Hwy E16 to Somerset. (See directions from Somerset to Leoni Meadows.)

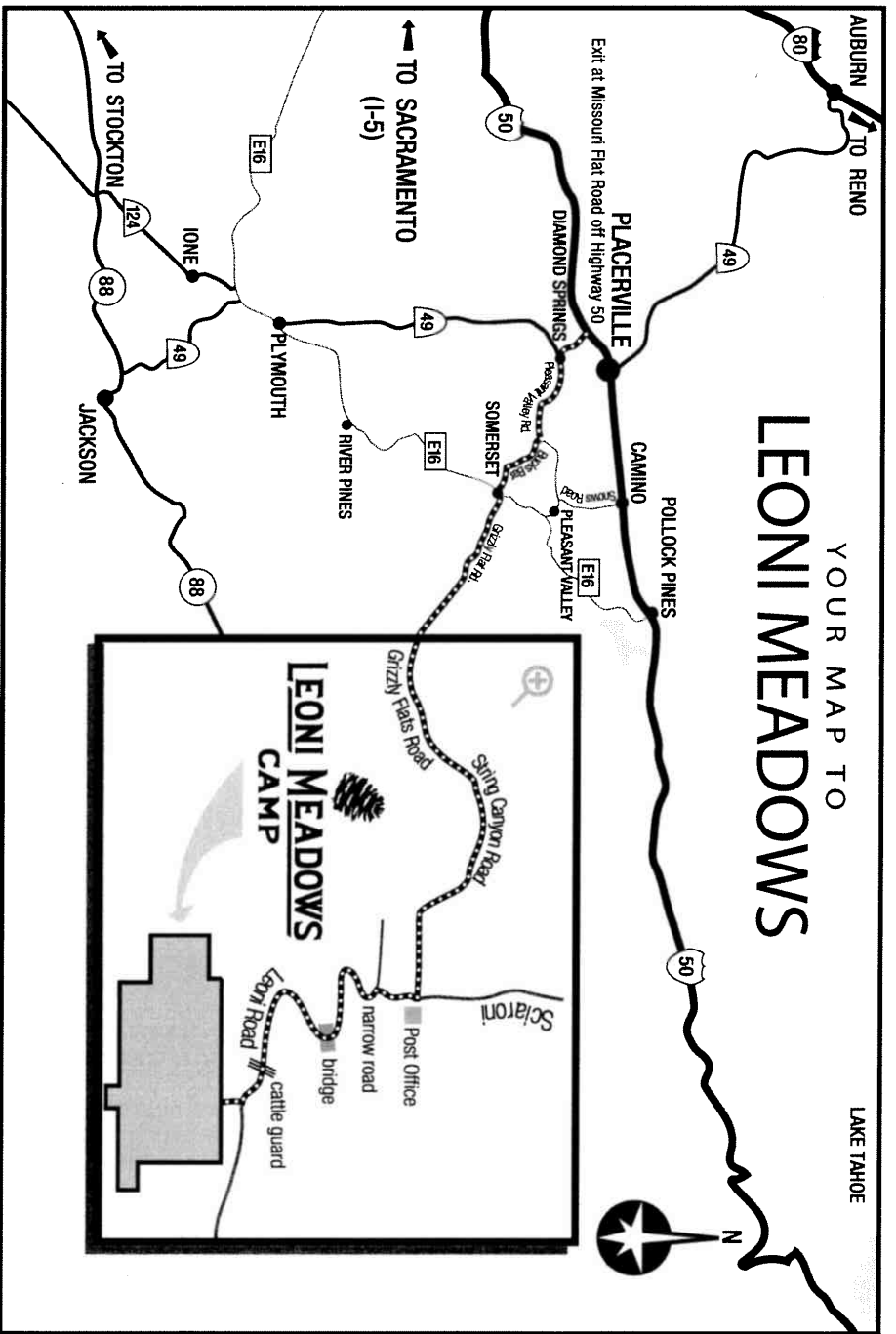
From Auburn—Grass Valley Area:
Take Hwy 49 south to Diamond Springs, turn left onto Pleasant Valley Road, continue on Pleasant Valley Road 5 miles to Bucks Bar Road, turn right and continue on Bucks Bar Road 4.8 miles to Somerset. (See directions from Somerset to Leoni Meadows.)

From Jackson—Sutter Creek Area:
Take Hwy 49 north to Hwy E16, turn right and continue on Hwy E16 to Somerset. (See directions from Somerset to Leoni Meadows.)

From Stockton—Lodi Area:
Take Hwy 88 northeast to Hwy 124 exit, turn left on Hwy 124 and continue to Hwy E16, turn right and continue on E16 to Somerset. (See directions from Somerset to Leoni Meadows.)

From Sacramento Area:
Take Hwy 50 to Missouri Flat Exit. Turn right off the freeway on Missouri Flat Road and continue to Pleasant Valley Road. Turn left and continue on Pleasant Valley Road 5.2 miles through Diamond Springs to Bucks Bar Road. Turn right on Bucks Bar Road, continue for 4.8 miles to Somerset. (See directions from Somerset to Leoni Meadows.)

Directions from Somerset to Leoni Meadows

Go east through Somerset on Grizzly Flats Road and stay on this road for 12.2 miles (road name changes to String Canyon Road at mile 8.6—stay to the left).

At the stop sign turn right onto Sciaroni Road. There is a Post Office across the street. NOTE: For motor homes and large vehicles, swing wide as this is a sharp right turn.

Go 0.3 miles to dead end. Turn left (green county road sign points to Leoni Meadows). Road narrows to one lane for 1/4 mile. At bottom of hill keep left. This is Leoni Road. Continue for 3 miles to the Leoni Meadows turnoff at large, wood Leoni Meadows sign. Turn right and go 1 mile, continuing past staff houses. The Leoni Lodge (with the office for registration) is the first large building on the left after the houses.

NOTE: Do yourself a favor by printing and using these directions, **not Google Maps, Mapquest or your GPS.** While those are great resources in many situations, they are not reliable for getting here. We're here to save you the frustration of taking two extra hours to arrive, getting lost or finding your route is under three feet of snow.
